As we continue to fight against COVID-19, healthcare providers (also defined as doctors of medicine) play an important role in our lives. 


Figure 1. Methods of Blocking Students from Browsing Inappropriate Websites

Do animals have a sixth sense? Can it be used to detect a natural disaster about to strike? For scientists, the answer is positive. In 2011, a research team used motion-triggered cameras to observe the wildlife in Yanachaga National Park, the Amazon rainforest in Peru. Just in a few days prior to a 7.0 magnitude earthquake in the Peruvian Andes, the team noted the number of wild animals had decreased and eventually disappeared. Likewise, a team of US scientists attached geolocators, lightweight tracking devices, to golden-winged warblers. They found that these warblers flew away from the Cumberland Mountains of eastern Tennessee, their habitats, to Florida or even Cuba, but several days later they flew back. According to the scientists, it was deadly storms that made these warblers fly more than 900 miles. In fact, there are numerous cases of how animals, such as dogs, sharks, and elephants, behave abnormally right before a natural disaster. Scientists are hence puzzled over animals' unusual behavior. Dr. Rachel Grant, an animal biologist at Anglia Ruskin University, said that natural disasters like earthquakes produce a force that hits the Earth's surface, creating an atmospheric change that causes a sense of unease. Other scientists explained that it is low-frequency sounds and vibrations that allow animals to sense upcoming danger. Basically, animals can flee away from the danger they sense to favor their survival success, and humans can interpret why animals move away from the unpleasant "stimuli." However, humans are still unable to use animals as monitoring systems effectively to protect our lives and property in time from natural disasters.
